


Dear Parents/Guardians,

Bicycle Reminder

With the warmer weather and melting of the winter snow, we are beginning to see some students riding their bikes to school. For safety reasons, we request that students follow these guidelines:

- Students should ride their bicycles up to the school grounds area, dismount and walk their bikes to the rack.
- Bicycles should be locked to the rack immediately.
- Bicycle racks are out of bounds during school hours.
- At noon or after school, when you are going home, students should walk their bikes to the end of the school grounds area and then proceed home.
- No bicycles should be ridden through the parking lot or the student pickup area.
- Bicyclists must wear an approved helmet at all times.

We often have well over one hundred bicycles at the racks. It does get crowded. Please follow the above guidelines to stay safe.

We have kicked off Jump Rope Club and Jump Rope for Heart! Students are welcome to drop in to jump with Jump Rope Club at Lunch Recess on their designated day of the week from April 9-May 9. Indigenous Corner...

Have you ever heard reference to "Turtle Island"? In many indigenous cultures, the turtle holds great significance as a symbol of creation, truth, longevity, wisdom, and stability. According to traditional creation stories, the earth was created on the back of a turtle, with various animals and beings living on its shell. Turtle Island represents the land upon which indigenous peoples have lived for thousands of years.

Different indigenous nations may have variations in their creation stories and interpretations of Turtle Island, but the concept generally embodies a deep spiritual and cultural connection to the land and all living beings. It is a term that carries profound significance and respect for the ancestral lands shared by many diverse First Nation, Métis and Inuit in North America.

The term "Turtle Island" also reclaims and reaffirms indigenous peoples' connection to the land, asserting inherent rights and responsibilities as its stewards. It serves as a reminder of enduring relationship with the natural world and their ongoing struggle for sovereignty, environmental protection, and cultural revitalization.

Did you know?

Alberta Reserves are accumulated surplus funds that may be designated to a school, department or priority. The Board of Trustees approves the transfer of funds to and from reserves and has a yearly plan on how those reserves are used—to the benefit of students. EIPS identifies high-demand areas and uses its operating reserves for initiatives like student learning, new curriculum work, consultant support, mental health initiatives, technology upgrades, public-health best practices and other one-time projects. Operating reserves are also used to furnish and equip new schools and classrooms. With its capital reserves, EIPS replaces ageing equipment, purchases technology, modernizes and expands student learning spaces, and funds emergent capital needs.


