Complete your Returning Student Registration: February 8-21

Elk Island Public Schools' (EIPS) returning student registration process is now open. For James Mowat Elementary families, <u>returning student registration</u> for the 2024-25 school year takes place at the same time as all other schools from February 8-21.

All current students must complete the online Returning Student Registration Form to confirm their enrolment in a school for the upcoming 2024-25 school year. Additionally, students who want to attend a non-designated school need to make that request through the returning student registration process—acceptance is based on available space. All current EIPS students are required to complete the form by Feb. 21, 2024.

To complete your child's returning student registration, refer to the Returning Student Registration Form email you received from Elk Island Public Schools via Permission Click on February 8. Families will receive one email for each student. No log in is required to complete the form.

Register Your Child for Kindergarten by March 8!

Is your child turning five on or before Dec. 31, 2024? Do you want them to attend James Mowat Elementary? If so, it's now time to register for kindergarten. New students entering kindergarten, with a sibling currently attending James Mowat Elementary and returning next year, are guaranteed a spot at the school—through the sibling clause. **However**, the new student must register by March 8—the random selection process deadline.

After March 8, the school will direct any new student registrations, including siblings, to the alternate-designated school—Fort Saskatchewan Elementary—unless space remains available in a particular grade at James Mowat Elementary. As such, make sure to complete your child's registration as soon as possible if you want them to attend James Mowat Elementary.

NOTE: The random selection process will only be required if the number of registrations received by March 8 exceeds the number of available spaces in one or more grades.

To register, simply complete the online registration form at eips.ca/kindergarten.

To help families prepare for kindergarten, Elk Island Public Schools has put together an online <u>EIPS Kindergarten Tool kit</u> to make the transition as smooth as possible. The kit includes information on calendars, fees, transportation and more.

Indigenous Corner...

PROTOCOL. You may have heard this word used in the context of First Nations, Métis and Inuit cultures. Each Nation is distinct and has their own understanding of what protocol means and how it is practiced. Generally speaking, protocol is a way to honour and respect Indigenous ways of being and doing and respect important ethical practices. Protocols are ways of establishing and maintaining respectful relations with Indigenous Peoples. For Nations that have protocol teachings, it can mean following the customs that describe appropriate and respectful behaviour when seeking knowledge, advice, expertise or service. Protocol is offered to serve each individual and with each request. It is important to ask about the proper protocol for any given situation.

Our Words, Our Ways (Alberta Education 2017) notes that protocols exist to

- build trusting, honest relationships
- show respect for Aboriginal (Indigenous) cultures, values and beliefs
- allow people to speak in the voice and style of their cultural group
- create balance in the consultation and negotiation process
- improve relations with Aboriginal (Indigenous) communities.

Complete the Alberta Education Assurance Survey

Once again, Alberta Education is surveying teachers, students and families through its annual Alberta Education Assurance (AEA) Survey. The survey gathers feedback on the quality of education provided by school authorities and their schools, which they then use to help understand how they're doing and plan for the future.

Throughout February, Grade 4 students at James Mowat Elementary are completing the survey online at the school. Student participation is voluntary and completely anonymous. Students are assigned a random username and password to ensure survey responses aren't linked to any individual student. The survey doesn't take long to complete and is done within the school day during regular class time.

Additionally, parents and guardians of students in these grades are also asked to take a survey online. Alberta Education has mailed families information about the survey directly. As with the student and teacher survey, it's anonymous and asks questions about your school experiences. If you have a child in these grades, we encourage you to participate. The survey deadline is March 1, 2024.

Results from the AEA Survey are provided to Elk Island Public Schools each spring. The Division then uses the data to inform its four-year education plan, school education plans and strategies for continuous improvement. Each fall, the results are also shared with EIPS families and school communities in the Division's Annual Education Results Report.
